

The Internal Medicine Residency program at Baylor Scott & White Medical Center in Round Rock is at the heart of our regional expansion into the vibrant and growing Austin region. Our emphasis is to provide the residents with an engaging learning environment, to cultivate a culture of lifelong learning and to foster excellence in quality of care, research, patient experience and cost efficiency.

Applications for the Texas A&M College of Medicine-Scott & White Medical Center (Round Rock) Internal Medicine residency program should be made using the Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS). We do not accept paper applications. The application deadline is November 30th each year. We accept six categorical internal medicine residents per year. Our program number is 1404800895.

Application Criteria

What information should be included with my ERAS application?

The following items are required with each application submitted for residency:

- Transcript from medical school
- Dean's letter
- Three (3) letters of recommendation
- Personal statement
- Curriculum vitae/resume
- Record of other graduate medical experience, if applicable
- USMLE or COMLEX Scores
- Recent photograph (optional)
- ECFMG certificate, if foreign medical graduate
- Foreign medical graduates must graduate from an approved school as determined by the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners

Am I required to have my Step 2 (COMLEX or USMLE) score prior to interview?

Applicants are not required to have their Step 2 scores prior to the interview; however, successful completion of Step 2 CK and CS is required before ranking.

Is there a minimum USMLE/COMLEX score for applying?

We do not have a minimum USMLE/COMLEX score. Each application is reviewed in its entirety for overall academic excellence, leadership ability, career development potential and personal character. Invitations are made based on a combination of factors, including USMLE scores, recommendation letters, clinical experience, and research.

Does your program accept non-US applicants (IMGs)?

Our program does consider non-US applicants. The following information serves as a guideline for those applicants:

- All applications should be sent through ERAS
- Evidence of clinic experience in U.S. (observerships etc.) is preferred
- IMG candidates should have passed USMLE Step 1 and 2 (both parts)
- IMG candidates must hold a valid certificate issued by the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG) to be appointed as a resident
- Be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident of the U.S., or possess a valid visa
- The program will sponsor J-1 Visa on a select basis (H-1B visas cannot be supported)

Is there a cutoff date for the medical degree?

We prefer completion of medical school within the last 5 years.

Does your program offer shadowing or observerships?

At this time our program does not offer observership opportunities.

Interviews

Our application deadline is November 30th; applications received after this deadline will not be considered. Applications will only be accepted through ERAS. All intern positions will be filled through the National Residency Matching Program (NRMP).

Once candidates have been selected for an interview, they will be invited via ERAS and allowed to schedule their interview. Remember that spots are filled on a competitive first-come, first-served basis. Interviews are held beginning in November and end in January. Interview dates will be communicated in the invitation to interview.

Candidates are invited to arrive in the area the night before and attend an informal dinner with current residents. The typical interview day will begin at 7:30 a.m. and conclude at approximately 3:00 p.m. and will include the following activities:

- Attendance at morning report
- Facility tour including hospital and clinic
- 3 faculty interviews including 1 with the Program Director
- Attendance at noon conference with lunch provided

Hotel accommodations are available at a discounted rate at various hotels; more information will be provided in the pre-interview correspondence. If you are unable to attend the interview, please notify us a minimum of 72 hours in advance. Personal transportation will be needed.
